One of the highest civilian honours in the country, the Order of Canada recognizes outstanding achievement, dedication to the community and service to our nation.

Dr. Ron Burnett is made a Member of the Order of Canada for his leadership in arts education, notably as president of Emily Carr University. With his vision and leadership, the Emily Carr community has achieved many significant milestones, over nearly two decades, to become the prestigious, globally recognized centre of art and design innovation it is today. These accomplishments will include the new purpose-built Emily Carr Campus at Great Northern Way.

Because of Dr. Burnett's outstanding contributions, today Emily Carr University is noted for: a values-driven culture; interdisciplinary balance between fine art, interactive media and communication design; and a strong focus on research, partnership and innovation. Ethics, social collaboration, as well as sustainability theory and ecological design practices are hallmarks of the curriculum and of Dr. Burnett's desire to graduate students who are uniquely suited to solving the complex problems facing our future.

Dr. Burnett is also a recipient of: the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012; the "Chevalier de l'ordre des Art et des Lettres", a knighthood from the French Government in 2010; Educator of the Year in Canada in 2005; the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal in 2002; and the Outstanding Leadership Award from the International Digital Media Arts Association. He currently sits on the boards of BCNet, the European League of Institutes of the Arts, AICAD, the Learning Development Institute, and is a former Chair of the Knowledge Network.

A photographer, videomaker, filmmaker and writer, Dr. Burnett is the author of over 150 essays, chapters and articles and has published three books, [Cultures of Vision: Images, Media and the Imaginary](#), [Explorations in Film Theory](#) and [How Images Think](#). Dr. Burnett is on [Twitter](#), [LinkedIn](#) and writes a weblog, established 1994, entitled [Critical Approaches to Culture + Media](#).

Well-known alumnus Douglas Coupland is made an Officer of the Order of Canada for his contributions to our examination of the contemporary human condition as a novelist, cultural commentator and artist. His fiction and recognized works in design and visual art include the international best seller *Generation X: Tales for an Accelerated Culture*, which popularized terms such as McJob and Generation X.

With 13 novels, two collections of short stories, seven non-fiction books and dramatic works and screenplays for film and television, Mr. Coupland is a prolific contributor to, and influencer of, Canadian and global culture, with his latest critically acclaimed contemporary novel, *Worst. Person. Ever.*, published in 2013.
